



## **AMENDED ORDER BY THE COUNTY JUDGE OF LLANO COUNTY**

### **“Llano County Stay Home-Stay Safe”**

**Whereas**, on April 1, 2020 the Llano County Judge issued the Llano County Stay Home-Stay Safe Order to be effective through April 30, 2020; and

**Whereas**, the Llano County Stay Home-Stay Safe Order is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth below; and

**Whereas**, On April 17, 2020 Governor Greg Abbott issued Executive Orders GA-16 relating to the safe re-opening of Texas; and

**Whereas**, Executive Order GA-16 supersedes GA-14, which restricted non-essential services during the COVID-19 disaster; and

**Whereas**, Executive Order GA-16, in compliance with guidance from DSHS Commissioner Dr. Hellerstedt and in alignment with the goals established by the President of the United States to reduce the spread of COVID-19, requires every person in Texas to, except where necessary to provide or obtain essential services or reopened services, minimize social gatherings and minimize in-person contact with people who are not in the same household.


**Whereas**, Executive Order GA-16 remains in effect and in full force until 11:59 on April 30, 2020, unless it is modified, amended, rescinded, or superseded by the governor.

**NOW THEREFORE, I, COUNTY JUDGE FOR THE COUNTY OF LLANO, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED BY TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE CHAPTER 418, HEREBY ORDER:**

That the current Llano County Stay Home-Stay Safe Order is modified to expire at 11:59 p.m. on April 20, 2020 and the citizens of Llano County shall adhere solely to the

guidance provided in Executive Order GA-16 and all other Executive Orders in effect as set forth by the Governor of Texas.
