Drought vs. Development

The Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) has placed Horseshoe Bay and neighboring Colorado River communities under Stage 2 drought restrictions (visit www.horseshoe-bay-tx.gov/stage2 to learn more). We are only allowed to water our lawns once per week.

I hear the following question often, "Why continue approving new construction during a drought?" This is a perfectly reasonable question and deserves an explanation.

The short answer is, "because we have to." Texas state law prohibits municipalities from imposing building moratoriums based on water supply unless we can demonstrate specific deficiencies in water provision or wastewater treatment capacity. Any such moratorium would require submitting a detailed remediation plan to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ).

Fortunately, our city has planned responsibly, ensuring our facilities can handle both current needs and projected growth for years ahead. Texas strongly protects property owners' rights—if someone owns properly zoned land in Horseshoe Bay, they retain the right to build according to existing ordinances.

While we depend entirely on Lake LBJ for water and cannot control inflow amounts, we are taking action. Our staff is developing an ordinance for new construction requiring drought-tolerant landscaping, limiting turf areas, and recommending appropriate grass varieties. We will also strictly enforce Stage 2 watering restrictions using available technology. I'm grateful for our citizens' understanding as we navigate this challenging time together. Please join me in hoping for rain soon!

Construction Progress

Both the City Center and West Fire Station projects remain on—or slightly ahead of—schedule! It's exciting to see the progress along FM 2147. The City Council will tour both construction sites on May 2, and we're eager to get a firsthand look at these spaces as they take shape. We're particularly motivated to complete the City Center as we have special plans for this location.

20th Anniversary Celebration

This September marks Horseshoe Bay's 20th anniversary, and we're planning a citywide celebration on October 25 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on the grounds of the new City Center. The event will feature ceremonies, festivities, and recognition of our city's achievements.
